#1 TAKE AI OUT OF THE EQUATION

INTERVIEWS RATHER THAN ESSAYS

- I think these will become THE academic route
- Essentially we cannot now trust digitally written essays

EXAMS / TIMED BRIEFS / STUDIO SESSIONS

- Will become more prevalent and useful in education
- So perhaps we need more reliance on "exam conditions"
- Smaller but more often



"SKETCHBOOKS" AS EVIDENCE

We need a more continual, light touch assessment. Regular catchup sessions

We need to know our students and their work / progress. Curveballs should be evident

OUR RECRUITMENT NEEDS TO CHANGE


- Again we cannot trust anything written digitally

Might Google and Bing penalise Al other than its own?


#3 KNOW YOUR ENEMY

WHAT ARE THE DANGERS OF AI FOR ART EDUCATORS? ACCORDING TO BARD
